IRA Donations for Charity

Another popular way to transfer IRA assets to charity is via a tax provision which allows IRA owners who are 70 1/2 or older to direct up to \$100,000 of their IRA distributions to charity. The money given to the charity counts toward the donor's required minimum distribution, but doesn't increase the donor's adjusted gross income or generate a tax bill. Keeping the donation out of the donor's adjusted gross income is important because doing so (1) helps the donor qualify for other tax breaks (for example, having a lower AGI can reduce the threshold for deducting medical expenses, which are only deductible to the extent they exceed 7.5% of AGI (10% of AGI for people under age 65 and for everyone after 2016));(2) reduces taxes on the donor's Social Security benefits and (3) helps the donor avoid a high-income surcharge for Medicare Part B and D premiums (which kick in if AGI is over certain levels).
